


# We goofed.



The corrections listed here should allow you to complete your project with ease. If not, give us a call at 800-426-3126 and we'll do our best to help. And again, many apologies for the error.


• On the right side of your work, insert your hook through the surface stitches of your piece, yarn over the hook and draw a loop back out through the surface stitches. You'll have one loop on your hook.




2 Insert your hook into a space very close to your starting point and draw out another loop of yarn through the surface of your piece. You'll have two loops on your hook. Yarn over the hook in preparation for making the single crochet in the next step.



**3** Pull the yarn through the two loops. You've just made a single crochet on the surface of your piece.



Repeat steps 2 and 3 to create a free-form line of single crochet along the surface of your piece. Depending on the pattern instructions, you may continue to work additional rows into these stitches. Fasten off and weave in ends when finished.





#### **TEETH (MAKE 2.)**

Using ivory yarn, make a 5-st adjustable ring.

Sc 1 in each sc. (5 sts) Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

## EAR (MAKE 2.)

Using purple yarn, loosely ch 6. Starting in 2nd ch from hook and working in back ridge loops, sc 2, hdc 2, dc 2 in back ridge loop of next ch. Rotate work. Starting in next st and working in front loops of ch, hdc 2, sc 2, sl st into next st and fasten off, leaving a long tail.

### NOSTRIL (MAKE 2.)


Using purple yarn, ch 7. Starting in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 6 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.




#### ASSEMBLY


With black yarn, form cheeks by drawing yarn through muzzle from underneath chin up through middle of foundation ch, then back under chin again, pulling yarn tightly to form 2 cheeks. Rep 2 or 3 times, ending underneath chin. Attach plastic eyes, 1 rnd above nose and cheeks, with 2 sts between them. Close hole at back of head. If you prefer, use black yarn to make French knots (page 16), or sew on felt circles for eyes.




With black yarn, embroider eyebrows using lazy daisy st (page 16). Fold nostril piece in half to form a loop and sew ends together to make a teardrop shape. Sew nostrils to front of head over 2 gaps on either side of foundation ch. Sew teeth below nostrils using whipstitch (page 17) so they point straight down.




3 Attach ears above eyes and eyebrows. Using fringe technique (page 19) and black yarn, cut 3 pieces, 4" long, and attach to top of head. Use tapestry needle to separate yarn strands and scissors to trim to desired length.



With larger, rounder end of body in back, attach head about 2 rnds above last rnd on body. Attach legs about halfway up on body. Attach tail.



• To keep legs from splaying out, attach yarn to inside surface of one leg, pass yarn through body to inside surface of opposite leg, then back again through body to your starting point. Pull yarn gently to draw legs close to body before fastening off. With ivory yarn, embroider 3 toenails using 5 satin sts (page 16) for each nail.



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
